Climate Action Charter

Run a People's Assembly on ways to take climate action at school.

- It is like a debate but the aim is for people to agree a way forward instead of pitching one point of view against the other.
- In groups students create a short presentation on an idea or theme such as energy.
- Everyone can ask questions and input help refine the ideas.
- Recommendations could be passed to an eco-group or SLT.

Lesson ideas

Students can think about different forms of climate action based on words they are given to define it. I.e. Climate action is...

....persuading

... doing nothing!

They can use the <u>COP26 Coalition</u> <u>People's Summit programme</u> to find examples of campaigns, jobs and other initiatives that related to their given word and to understand the broad scope of climate action.
