



Climate Conference December 2021

To give pupils their voice on climate action



Year 6 pupils researched areas of Climate Change such as 'Fast Fashion', 'Plastic Pollution' and 'Ways we can help'. They created display presentation boards that showcased their learning and lots of facts.

In English, the children worked on climate speeches, having watched the likes of Greta Thunberg, Sir David Attenborough and Prince William, discuss the global impacts of climate change. They used this to write their own powerful climate speeches and performed them for various teachers around the school.

The children's current PBL (Project Based Learning) topic was centered around learning about the Arctic. From that, links were made to the polar ice caps melting at an unprecedented rate and in turn to climate change.

We spent the afternoons for around 5 weeks on this project, mostly whole-class lessons but for the lead up to the conference, children worked in specific groups and with an additional adult fine-tuned and practise their presentations.
